THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COUNCIL AND THE WASHINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MET ON SEPTEMBER 15, 2025 AT 9:00 A.M. THE MEETING WAS LOCATED AT THE WASHINGTON COUNTY COURTHOUSE, 99 PUBLIC SQUARE, SUITE 200, SALEM, INDIANA. IN ATTENDANCE WERE COUNCILMEMBERS: MARK ABBOTT, GERALD FLEMING, BRAD GILBERT, ANDREW DAVISSON, TODD ARMSTRONG, PRESTON SHELL; ATTORNEY ALYSSA COCHRAN; COMMISSIONERS TODD EWEN AND TONY CARDWELL; AUDITOR KYRA STEPHENSON AND DEPUTY AUDITOR MICHELE FLEENOR. COUNCILMEMBER WISCHMEIER AND COMMISSIONER MARSHALL WERE ABSENT.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT ABBOTT CALLED THE COUNCIL TO ORDER.

COMMISSIONER VICE-PRESIDENT EWEN CALLED THE COMMISSIONERS TO ORDER.

COUNCILMEMBER GILBERT LED THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE FOLLOWED BY PRAYER LED BY COUNCILMEMBER FLEMING.

COUNCILMEMBER DAVISSON MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE AUGUST 4TH, AUGUST 19TH, AND THE AUGUST 20TH-22ND COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES. THE MOTION WAS SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER SHELL. THE MOTION PASSED.

PUBLIC COMMENT

*MAX GREEN IS REQUESTING THE COUNTY TO NOT FUND ANY BOARDS THAT ARE NOT COMPLYING WITH THE LIVESTREAM LAW. MR. GREEN DOES NOT WANT TO HAVE THE PLANNING COMMISSION FUNDED DUE TO THE BOARD BEING ILLEGAL AND NOT POSTING MEETINGS PROPERLY.

*SHERIFF BRENT MILLER SPOKE ABOUT THE 2026 BUDGET OVERTIME REQUEST. STAFF TURNOVER, HOLIDAYS AND COVERING SHIFTS FOR VACATION TIME IS A FEW OF THE REASONS THIS LINE ITEM IS SO HIGH. COUNCILMEMBER ARMSTRONG ASKED IF IT WOULD HELP IF THE COUNTY BOUGHT BACK VACATION TIME. MILLER THINKS IT WOULD HELP BUT NOT SURE HOW MUCH.

PUBLIC DEFENDER

CHIEF PUBLIC DEFENDER RYAN BOWER ASKED TO AMEND HIS 2026 BUDGET REQUEST. BOWER WOULD LIKE THE TWO SECRETARIAL POSITIONS MOVED TO \$44,000 EACH SO THE OFFICE CAN HIRE SOMEONE WITH EXPERIENCE IN THE OPEN POSITION. BOWER WOULD ALSO LIKE THE OFFICE MANAGER INCREASED TO \$56,000. BOWER STATED HE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE THOSE SALARIES CHANGED FOR 2025.
