THE EXECUTIVE SESSION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS WAS HELD AT 8:00 A.M. PRESENT WERE COMMISSIONER PHILLIP MARSHALL, COMMISSIONER TODD EWEN, COMMISSIONER TONY CARDWELL, ATTORNEY APRIL GELTMAKER, AND AUDITOR KYRA STEPHENSON. THE UNDERSIGNED CERTIFY THAT THE ONLY ITEMS DISCUSSED WERE I.C. 5-14-1.5-6.1(b)(2)(B) INITIATION OF LITIGATION OR LITIGATION THAT IS EITHER PENDING OR HAS BEEN THREATENED SPECIFICALLY IN WRITING.

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY COMMISSIONER MARSHALL.

CARDWELL LED THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. COMMISSIONER EWEN GAVE THE PRAYER.

RHONDA GREENE REQUESTED TO BE ON THE AGENDA BUT WAS UNABLE TO ATTEND.

COMPLAIN ABOUT THE STRUCTURE OF THE PLAN COMMISSION. SHE, LIKE RHONDA

GREENE,

BELIEVE THE BOARD IS ILLEGAL AND THE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE IS

VIOLATING

PROPERTY OWNERS RIGHTS. SHE ASKED THE COMMISSIONERS TO MAKE A MOTION

TO

DISBAN THE PLAN COMMISSION. THE COMMISSIONERS WANT TO ALLOW THE PLAN

COMMISSION TIME TO WORK FURTHER ON THE ZONING ORDINANCE. ATTORNEY

DAVID KOLLE – SNOW REMOVAL REIMBURSEMENT

MR KOLLE CAME AGAIN TO REQUEST THE COUNTY REIMBURSE HIM FOR SNOW REMOVAL THAT HE PAID FOR. MR KOLLE LIVES IN HARDINSBURG AND PAID SOMEONE TO DO SNOW REMOVAL IN THE ALLEY BEHIND HIS HOUSE. HE ALSO ADDRESSED THE COMMISSIONERS ABOUT ADOPTING ALL THE ROADS IN HARDINSBURG. SUPERINTENDENT VOYLES SPOKE AGAIN ABOUT THE STREETS IN HARDINSBURG ADDING THAT A LOT OF THE STREETS ARE SIMPLY NOT STREETS BUT MORE LIKE ALLEYS AND NOT WIDE ENOUGH FOR DUMP TRUCKS TO ACCESS. SOME OF THE STREETS ARE BLOCKED OFF BY BARRICADES OR HAVE BUILDINGS IN THE MIDDLE OF THEM. THE SNOW REIMBURSEMENT WAS NOT DISCUSSED AGAIN AND NO DECISION WAS MADE.

COMMISSIONERS. WHILE THERE IS NO SPECIFIC STATUTORY AUTHORITY THAT GUARANTEES

THE RIGHT TO SPEAK AT THESE PUBLIC MEETINGS, A GOVERNING BODY HAS DISCRETION

WHETHER TO ALLOW PUBLIC COMMENT AND MAY SE REASONABLE RULES THAT
GOVERN THE

~~CONDUCT OF THE MEETING. SPEAKERS WHO WISH TO SPEAK AT A COMMISSIONER~~
MEETING
MUST SIGN UP WITH THE AUDITOR NO LATER THAN TWENTY-FOUR HOURS PRIOR TO
THE
MEETING. THE PUBLIC WILL BE ALLOWED THREE MINUTES TO SPEAK.

OPIOID APPLICATION

MYRA ALBERTSON REPRESENTING THE JRAC BOARD SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION FOR
THE
OPIOID FUNDS. THE APPLICATION SUBMITTED WAS FROM OUR PLACE DRUG AND
ALCOHOL
EDUCATION SERVICES, INC.. THE JRAC BOARD HAS REVIEWED THE APPLICATAION AND
FOUND IT APPROPRIATE TO FUND. THE TOTAL FUNDS WILL BE FOR ONE YEAR IN THE
AMOUNT
OF \$81,221.94. THE FUNDS WILL BE USED TO HIRE AN ADDITIONAL CASE MANAGER
WHO WILL
EXPAND PROGRAMMING CURRENTLY PROVIDED IN THE WASHINGTON COUNTY JAIL
AND ALSO
WORK WITH THE WASHINGTON COUNTY SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE ASSESSEMENTS AND
INTERVENTION TO STUDENTS WHO VIOLATE SCHOOL POLICY. MONEY WILL BE USED
FROM
BOTH THE RESTRICTED AND UNSTRICED FUNDS. THE AMOUNT OUT OF RESTRICTED
FUNDS
WILL BE \$27,997.70 AND THE AMOUNT OUT OF UNRESTRICTED FUNDS WILL BE
\$53,224.24.
COMMISSIONER MARSHALL MADE A MOTION TO APPROVE THE FUNDING REQUEST
PER THE
JRAC'S RECOMMENDATION. MOTION WAS SECONDED BY CARDWELL. MOTION
PASSED.

WEST WASHINGTON SCHOOLS HAD APPLIED FOR MONIES FROM THE OPIOID FUND.

HIGHWAY PROJECT – PAUL ECKART

PAUL ECKART WITH TEMPLE AND TEMPLE GAVE AN UPDATE ON THE PROGRESS OF THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT. THE PLUMBING AND HVAC HAVE BEEN ROUGHED IN. THE ELECTRIC AND INTERNET WILL BE ROUGHED IN NEXT WEEK. THE SIGN SHED IS CONSTRUCTED AND READY TO BE INSULATED. THE TRUCK LEAN TO IS ABOUT 80% COMPLETE. THE FRAMING OF THE FUEL SHED WILL BE BEGIN SOON IF THE WEATHER HOLDS. THE FOOTINGS AND FOUNDATION ARE INSTALLED. THE FOUNDATION IS ALL THEY HAVE PERMITTED TO DO SO FAR. THEY ARE WAITING ON PERMITS TO FINALIZE THE BUILD OF THE MECHANICS GARAGE. INDOT WILL BE WORKING ON CLEARING THE BRUSH AND TREES BEHIND THE TRUCK LEAN TO AND THE BYPASS SOON. DUKE ENERGY IS APPROXIMATELY TWO WEEKS OUT FROM RUNNING ELECTRIC TO THE LAND. PAUL HAS BEEN TALKING WITH MIDWEST GAS AND HAS CALLED IN FOR LOCATES FOR THE GAS MAIN FROM BECKS MILL ROAD DOWN TO THE SITE.
